Aligned with Consent and Respectful Relationships Education, Power to Kids supports schools to meet the Child Safe Standards.

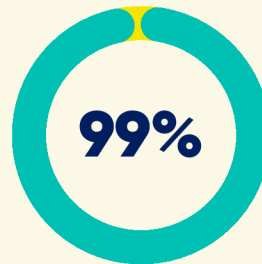
Power to Kids Whole-of-School Approach
